MRRH is located at Taree in the beautiful Manning Valley and provides maternity and birthing services for the Manning and Great Lakes region. MRRH has a 24 hour Emergency Department, a range of inpatient specialist services and outpatient clinics. The tertiary hospital for MRRH is the John Hunter Hospital (JHH) in Newcastle.

Manning Maternity currently has 650 births a year. Manning Maternity offers women in the region a number of woman centred care options for maternity care. This is provided by a team of experienced and dedicated midwives. The midwives work collaboratively with obstetricians and pediatrician's to provide the best experience for the women and their families. Our close ties with Child and Health Nursing supports continuity of care from one service to another.

Manning Maternity partners with women during their pregnancy, birth & the postnatal period. The primary focus is woman and their families. Midwives and the medical teams are skilled in the provision of high risk care when required for complex pregnancies.

Manning Maternity is committed to launching continuity of care & woman centred midwifery services in response to best practice guidelines to meet the needs of women in our community.

Manning Maternity has developed collaborative links with Child and Family Health services, Aboriginal Health Services, Mental Health Services GeneticCounselling,Occupational ,Therapy,Physiotherapy,Psychol ogy, Social Workers, Speech Pathology, State Wide Infant Hearing Services, Alcohol and Other Drugs Service, Sexual Health, Women's Health and Diabetic Services.

Midwifery students at Manning Maternity will have opportunity to experience midwifery practice supportive environment in all areas relevant to midwifery practice. These experiences will be achieved within the hospital and the community settings. The focus on education is consistent with and will meet the clinical requirements of the University Program, and will prepare midwives for practice now and into the future.
