Miriam Bender, PhD RN; Co Editor-in-Chief, Nursing Philosophy, is Associate Professor at the University of California Irvine's Sue & Bill Gross School of Nursing. Empirically, Associate Professor Bender's research focuses on the relationality between the organization of healthcare delivery, multi-professional practice dynamics, and patient care quality and safety outcomes. This program of research intersects with implementation science as it explores the connectivity of healthcare interventions, contexts (people, things, and practices that characterize where an intervention is introduced), and implementation (the ways an intervention is operationalized into practice) and how that connectivity influences healthcare outcomes.
