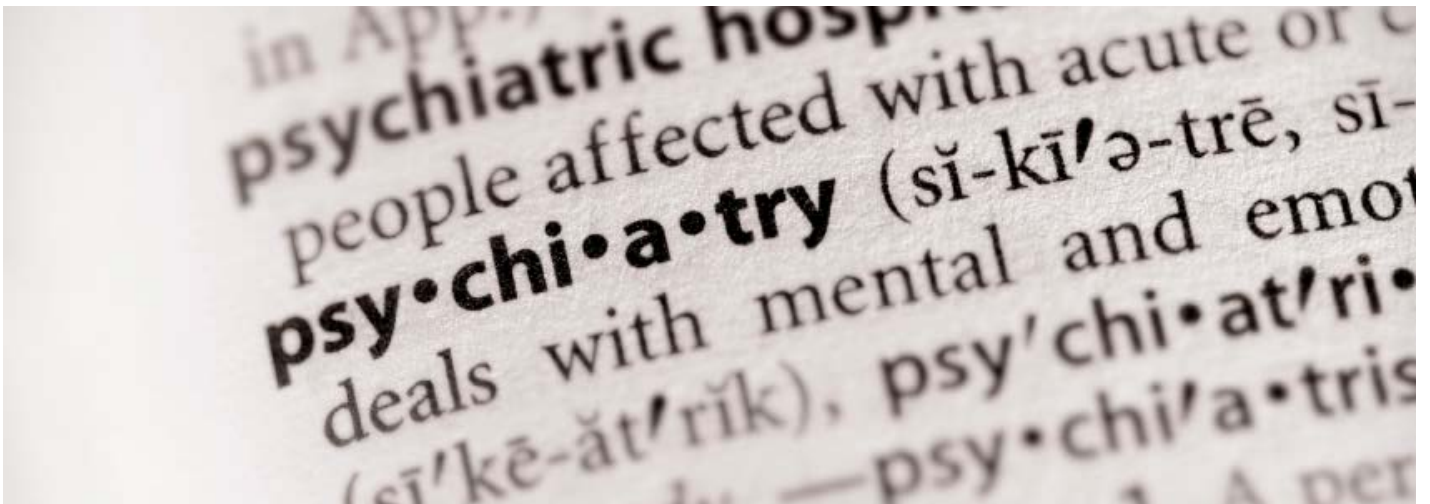


Interested in psychiatry training? Love the rural life?



Integrated Rural Training Pathway (IRTP) IN HNET PSYCHIATRY

Hunter New England Training in Psychiatry (HNET) is the only NSW provider to have received inaugural funding for the Stage 1-3 IRTP for psychiatry. This is an exciting opportunity for trainees as the funding will 'follow' the trainee through multiple rotations at a health service. This funding allows trainees to 'tailor-make' a part of their advanced training around their area of interest / research, pending approval by the network and accreditation by the RANZCP.

The Integrated Rural Training Pipeline (IRTP) initiative is a Commonwealth Government program aimed at increasing the number of psychiatry trainees and specialists in rural and regional areas. The objective set by the Commonwealth requires that trainees funded under the IRTP complete a target of 75% of their Fellowship training (66% minimum) in a rural or regional area (RA2-5). The IRTP posts differ from the Specialist Training Program (STP) posts as Trainees will complete their entire RANZCP training pathway with a health service.

HNET Psychiatry is well-known for the high quality of its training programs (www.hnehealth.nsw.gov.au/hnet) and offers a range of accredited terms (e.g., Adult, Addiction, Neuropsychiatry, Forensic, Education, Child & Adolescent) in RA2-5 that would allow trainees to meet requirements of the IRTP.
